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British Science Week

The theme for 2023 is 'Connections'.

Thank you to all staff for providing lots of fun activities this week to encourage a love of Science, develop knowledge of famous Scientists and tackle stereotypes. The children have...

Owls: Have been experimenting with colour, making their own rainbows by adding different colours to fabric and submerging them in water, observing the colours 'drifting' into one another.

Kestrels: Over the last 3 weeks Kestrels have been monitoring the weather in Hazelbury Bryan using their own rain gauges and windsocks. One day this week it was so blustery some windsocks escaped and flew over the school!

Hawks: Explored how water is transported through plants by using food colouring. Challenged stereotypes around Scientists. Explored air resistance and made a parachute to try and safely land an egg without it breaking!

Eagles: Researched scientists that challenge stereotypes, explored mixing different substances together to observe the reactions which involved fizzy colours and plastic! Made connections with our natural world through art.
